John Neely has been Music Director of the Bach Society of Dayton since its inception in 2002. For the past 37 years he has served as Associate Pastor for Music at Westminster Presbyterian Church in downtown Dayton. John has taught in the music departments of Washington and Jefferson College in Washington, Pennsylvania, and Mt. Union College in Alliance, Ohio. He has been Dean of the Canton and Dayton Chapters of the American Guild of Organists and was national president of the Presbyterian Association of Musicians.

John is recognized nationally as an organ recitalist, conductor, and choral clinician, having conducted workshops most recently in Ft. Worth, Texas; Portland, Oregon; and Tallahassee, Florida. He holds degrees from Duquesne University, Union Theological Seminary School of Sacred Music, and Pittsburgh Theological Seminary.



**R. Alan Kimbrough**, retired professor of English at the University of Dayton, is well known within the Dayton arts community as an outstanding organistaccompanist. Dr. Kimbrough was the accompanist for the former Dayton Bach Society from 1974 to 2002. He is a long-time member of the American Guild of Organists and is currently a co-organist at the First Baptist Church of Dayton.

### **Concert Preview**



**Eric Knorr**, founder of Oakwood Brass, is the Artist in Residence in Trumpet in the Department of Music at the University of Dayton. Professor Knorr teaches studio trumpet, directs the UD Trumpet Ensemble, performs with the Faculty Brass Quintet, and teaches several classroom courses within the department: Music, Technology and Culture and the History of American Popular Song. Professor Knorr previously held positions at Wright State University, Central State University, Wilberforce University, and Sinclair Community College, and maintains

an active studio of private students. Mr. Knorr is the retired Principal Trumpet of the United States Air Force Band of Flight at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base.

As an orchestral musician, Mr. Knorr is a regular substitute within the trumpet section of the Dayton Philharmonic Orchestra, is the Principal Trumpet with the Bach Society of Dayton, and is a frequent substitute with the Cincinnati Symphony and Cincinnati Pops Orchestras. Equally at home in commercial, jazz and rock settings, he has performed with Dayton Jazz Orchestra, the Jazz Central Big Band, and is the lead trumpet in the band Trey Stone and the Ringers. As a free-lance musician with the Victoria Theater Association, he has performed for the national touring productions of *Cinderella, The Little Mermaid, Motown, In The Heights, Chicago, Beautiful,* and *Book of Mormon.* 



## **Guest Artists**

### Oakwood Brass Eric Knorr, Group Leader

**Oakwood Brass**, founded in 2001 and led by Eric Knorr since that time, comprises some of the top performers in the state who regularly perform with the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra and Cincinnati Pops, the Dayton Philharmonic, the Columbus Symphony, the Lexington Philharmonic, the Springfield Symphony, and many others. They have been featured artists twice before on the Bach Society of Dayton subscription concert series and have also made regular appearances on the High St. UMC Sanctuary Series in Springfield, the Troy-Hayner Center Concert Series, and at Worthington Presbyterian Church in Columbus. They have been heard in radio re-broadcasts on WDPR 88.1 FM and were command performers at a WDPR event featuring violinist Rachel Barton-Pine.

They are the brass group in residence at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Dayton, performing for special church holidays, and are the core members of the orchestra during May Festival. In addition to their performance credentials, many of the group's members are prominent educators at such institutions as Wright State University, the University of Dayton, the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, and Cedarville University.




